Starting with a Photo: Create a Fabric Collage of your Pet

Materials List

Jane Haworth Quilt Artist www.janehaworth.com

- 8" x 10" photo of your pet's face in color and black and white, you may need to crop this to center the face, and then enlarge to fill the page.
- Take this photo to a printer shop and get a black and white enlargement at 200% (about a 20" quilt) or go larger 250% or 300%. Bring this for your pattern.
- I will have more details on my website janehhaworth.com
- Up to 1 yd of lightweight interfacing, something like Pellon Tru-grid or Easy Pattern. Does not need to be fusible just so you can see through it.
- A variety of fabrics to match the colors in the photo bring all values. Small pieces and some larger. Adding some unusual colors, textures, small scale prints, batiks will add interest to the quilt. I encourage students to share fabrics since such small pieces are used.
- Pencil, Chalk pencil or similar fabric marking tools. Disappearing ink pen can work. (Bohin chalk pencil)
- Black permanent marker Sharpie Fine (not ultra-fine)

• Scissors, sharp and good for cutting small pieces of fabric. I use KKB 6" perfect scissors

• Alennes Original Tacky Glue or other fabric glue, Can be glue bottle with needle dispenser. Tool for applying glue like a toothpick or I have glue applicators for sale.



- Optional tweezers and battery powered light box.. think of phone charger pack.
- Background fabric approx ³/₄ yd I usually chose this after the portrait is made. Look for good contrast.
