



## *Welcome to Petite Piping Thread Catcher - a Study of 3 Piping Techniques!*

Over and over again I hear from sewists that piping is difficult, time consuming, and scary. I created the Petite Piping Thread Catcher to show you it isn't so! I will take you step by step through the process of creating and inserting petite piping, from calculating the correct bias width to attaching to your garment with invisible seams.

I will also show you 3 different techniques for insert piping into garments. We will start with a classic piping insertion, then move on to a finished edge piping. Finally, you will learn how to insert piping in the round, with an invisible join and smooth flat seams - no bulk!

Your kit will include Liberty of London Tana lawn, cotton gingham, (there will be an assortment of color options), Petite Piping Cord, hand and machine needles, fusible interfacing and color instruction handouts. The outer fabric will already be fused and cut for you.

### Student Supplies:

- Rotary cutter, mat and ruler \*

(You can mark and cut the bias strips with scissors but it will be much easier and quicker to use a rotary cutter. If you are with a friend, it is very worable to share).

- Scissors

- Clips or pins

- Pencil or water soluble marker
