

## Pathways Supply List (Houston 2023)

**Abstract:** Life does not take us in a straight path, instead it winds us along a curvy path, sometimes even in circles. But don't fret, those curves are meant to take you right where you belong. Celebrate those twists and turns in your life, and create your own pathway. In this class you will create the center portion of Pathways, without the use of a sewing machine! Yes, you will need one to finish your top, but that simple piecing can be done at home. Come learn my no sew technique for making this fun and eclectic quilt top. Use two primary colors or as many as you like. The fun is in making this piece represent your life. I will provide a line drawing as a guideline for the center of the quilt top and step you through pulling it all together.

**Duration:** Full day (6 hours)

**Skill Level:** Intermediate

### **Supplies:**

#### Class kit

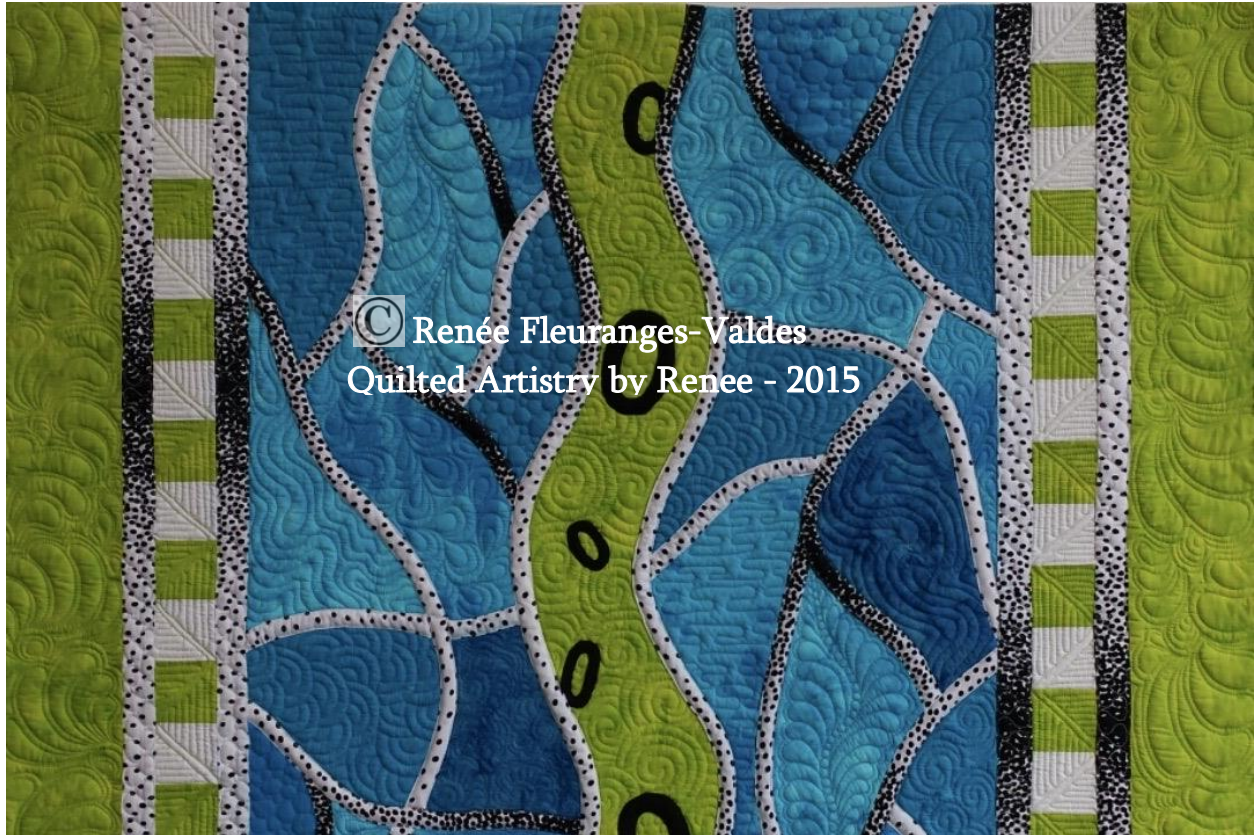
- Freezer Paper
- 1/2" bias tape maker
- Roxanne Glue Baste It, 2-Ounce Temporary Basting Glue (with applicator)
- Large (34" x 36") workspace to build your pathway on
- 30" x 36" ultra lightweight dressmakers fusible interfacing

#### Additional needed supplies (not in class kit)

- Straight pins
- Scissors - both paper and fabric
- Pencil
- Rotary cutter
- Cutting mat to cut bias strips
- 36" long quilting ruler (can use a shorter one in class)
- 2 yards of fabric to be used for your thin paths and side borders. I like small prints, dots or stripes as it adds interest.
- 6-8 fat qtrs that read as solids
- 1/2 yd fabric for the center pathway (more if you are using the same fabric in your border)
- 1 fat qtr of very dark or very light fabric for ovals (I will have swirl patterns as an alternative)
- Assorted fabrics for side blocks and border (you won't need this in class, as borders are added later)
