

OH MY STARS SUPPLY LIST
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There is a lot to learn with this one—45 degree angle cuts, simple math for quilters, how to sew and measure accurately with those angles, how to avoid Y-seams should you prefer that. And so much more.



FABRIC REQUIREMENTS for the entire quilt: mine is 97” square In class you will get 1 large Star done.

No need to bring ALL this fabric to class—plan ONE large Star, 5 fabrics and background.

3.5-4 yards Light Background for the quilt, use a variety that look similar if you like

2.5 yards Light Background for the small stars

28 quarter yards of a wide variety of prints, fat quarters are fine

Sashing and Borders will be discussed in class.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS for ONE Star block and 16 small stars: mine is 34” square. This is PLENTY of Fabric to bring to a 6 hour class:

1 yard Light Background

12 quarter yards, or more, of a wide variety of prints, fat quarters are fine. It is helpful to use sizing or Best Press on the fabrics BEFORE cutting.

SUPPLIES/NOTIONS:

Rotary cutter with fresh blade, Scissors/snips for thread

Cutting mat, 18” x 24”

Rulers: 6” x 24”, 6.5” x 12”, and 8.5” Square Quality rulers are essential—Creative Grids or Quilters Select are strongly recommended. Shorter rulers, 6.5” x 12” will work if necessary. Longer rulers are hard to transport.

OPTIONAL: BlocLoc Flying Geese ruler, 1” x 2” size is VERY helpful if making the Small Stars according to the pattern instructions. I have a fun, easy, fast way to make the small stars as an alternative method that does not use Flying Geese. My sample large quilt uses both small stars.

Thread for piecing, neutral colors, this may be provided by Sewing Machine company in class

Pins for piecing, fine glass head pins are best

Stitch Ripper

Mechanical Pencil with additional leads

Chalk pencils for marking on the back side of various fabrics, white and yellow work well
