

# Rabbit and Lupine Materials List

Make a charming fabric rabbit that can be nestled into a bed of purple lupine Wildflowers. Working from the two patterns use Jane's forgiving fabric collage technique to complete the rabbit. Then create a few simple stalks of lupines to complete the scene. Great project for using your scraps or small pieces of fabric. Rabbit is approx. 16" tall.



## You will need:

**Fabric:** A variety of browns and cream fabric for the rabbit, sizes from 2"-8", in solids, small prints, Kaffes, batiks, textures, tone-on-tone etc.

**Fabrics for the lupines,** a variety of purples, lilacs in light, med and dark. Also a variety of green fabrics for the leaves. Approx. sizes from 4" - 6" pieces.

Small piece of Pellon 830 or pattern ease for behind the 16" rabbit.

## Fabric Collage Tools:

- Pencil,
- Chalk marking tool, pencil or white pencil, or disappearing pen. I like the Bohin chunky chalk marker.
- Fabric glue (I use Alennes Tacky Glue, the gold one) and applicator or I have the applicators for sale \$1
- Good, sharp small scissors (I use Karen Kay Buckley 6" scissors) •
- Optional: Lightbox. Battery powered to work in the classroom
- Optional: Tweezers

To complete the scene you will need a sky or blue fabric and green for the background. I included old linens, hankies and a doily in my background. You can consider this before class or after the collage is complete.
